YOUTH JUSTICE SERVICE ADVISORY BOARD

ADVISORY BOARD MEMBER

WHAT IS IT?

An advisory board is a group of young people that provide advice and guidance to the management of an organisation.

For example, if the YJS would like some advice and views on engagement, they can go to the board and the young people will give their views on a particular issue.

WE ARE LOOKING FOR ENTHUSIASTIC, MOTIVATED YOUNG PEOPLE WHO WANT TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE AND HELP TO IMPROVE THE LIVES OF OTHER YOUNG PEOPLE.

WHEN DO THEY MEET?

The board will meet on a monthly basis at a time convenient for everyone. It's informal and there is no dress code.

DO I GET PAID?

Membership of the advisory board is currently on a voluntary basis but there will be incentives given such as vouchers, trips etc. in recognition and appreciation of your time.

WHAT'S IN IT FOR ME?

As a member of the advisory board you will be able to shape and influence the work the YJS does with young people and it gives you a chance to speak up and share your ideas on how the service can improve.

YOUTH COMMISSIONER

WHAT IS IT?

A Youth Commissioner is someone who will be trained to carry out work on behalf of the YJS. For example, you may be asked to speak to a number of young people to get their views and allow them to support, challenge and have their say. This role helps the YJS make better decisions to meet the needs of young people.

DO I GET PAID?

Yes, you will be set up with a zero-hour contract and VfC will also cover all travel expenses for you.

WHAT'S IN IT FOR ME?

This role will enable you to work with frontline practitioners and managers in the YJS as well as young people involved with the service. The work you will undertake has a direct impact on how the service works. This will also give you the opportunity to be part of an expanding local social enterprise that has been set up to make a difference in the lives of young people. VfC will provide training to ensure you have the knowledge and skills needed to undertake the role and deliver a good service.
